Background Information

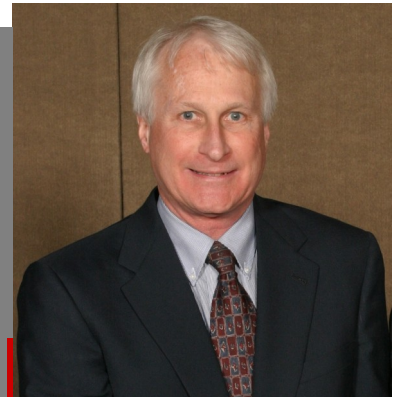
A VOC (volatile organic compound) is defined as organic chemical compounds that have high enough vapor pressures under normal conditions to significantly vaporize and enter the earth's atmosphere.

The Issue

The Southern California Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) is under federal EPA order to reduce VOCs in the four-county area in the Los Angeles basin. They were using gas chromatography to try and measure VOCs, but there was concern that they could regulate certain vanishing oils out of use in this area. There was a need for a new test method to measure VOCs in lubricants or rust and corrosion inhibitors.

The Agenda

John Burke walks through the background information, the regulation, the new test method and measurement and the impact it will have, not just on California, but on the industry.
